


Programs for Adults



New Lyceum Lecture Series – Illinois Rogues Gallery: Monday, May 19, 7 p.m. Six Illinois governors were found guilty of corruption and at least one governor was acquitted under suspicious circumstances. Author Dave Clark talks about the history of corruption in Illinois—including former governors George Ryan and Rod Blagojevich and Dixon comptroller Rita Crundwell—and questions when Illinois will be ready for reform. Registration required.

Book Discussion: The Map of Lost Memories by Kim Fay, Tuesday, **May 13**, 7:30 p.m. In this novel, set in the early 1900s, a woman sets off on a search for an archaeological treasure. History, politics, and art play a role in this story of discovery that could not only change history, but also the lives of those involved. *No registration required.*

Books Between Bites: Thursday, May 15, 12 p.m. Travel back in time with an enchanting tale by Indiana author and naturalist Gene Stratton-Porter. *A Girl of the Limberlost*, first published in 1909, follows young Elnora Comstock as she matures from awkward teen to fine young adult—a spectacular transformation mirrored by the book's other leading characters, the caterpillars and moths. Presenter Pam Otto, who also dabbles in writing and nature in her work as a St. Charles Park District manager, will highlight specific passages and present real-life examples of the moths portrayed in Stratton-Porter's vivid prose. *No registration required.*



Computer Classes for Adults


