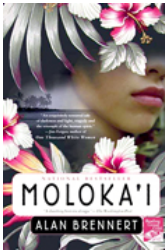
Machine Sewing for Beginners: Saturday, **October 24**, 9:30 a.m.–11:30 a.m.

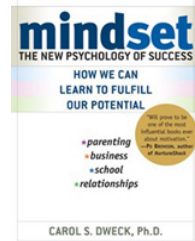
