LIBRARY RENOVATION PROJECT

As outlined in our recently completed strategic plan, the Batavia Public Library is committed to providing excellent user experiences. Two key goals support this commitment: optimizing the function and comfort of our library spaces and improving accessibility to enhance ease of use for both patrons and staff.

Since the Library opened in 2002, no major updates or changes to our building have occurred. Now it is time for a significant refresh and reimagining of our interior spaces. We are excited to share that several important renovation projects are on the horizon, including a new roof and improvements to the interior layout and design of the Library while respecting its classical design.

The Library has been preparing financially for this renovation for years, allocating funds to our Capital Improvement Fund at the end of each fiscal year to ensure a responsible and sustainable approach. As of June 2025, Batavia Public Library has saved \$6.5 million to fund both the roof replacement and interior renovation projects. These improvements will be

completed without increasing the Library's levy or seeking a referendum.

The roof replacement is scheduled for this summer and fall and is expected to have minimal impact on day-to-day operations.

We are in the early planning stages for the interior renovation, with a goal for work to begin in early 2026.

We will provide regular updates on these projects and notify the community in advance of any temporary impact on services. Updates will be posted on the Library's website.

We are excited about what's ahead and look forward to creating an even more welcoming, functional, and accessible library for the entire Batavia community.





BRAINFUSE ONLINE TUTORING AND SO MUCH MORE

Live online tutoring for all learners

Patrons may access real-time assistance through the intuitive Brainfuse online classroom in HelpNow. Brainfuse tutors are trained not to provide answers, but to help users master a problem's underlying academic concepts. Brainfuse offers tutoring and homework help services in Spanish for all subjects that are offered in English. Tutoring assistance, including test prep, is available for students in grades K-12.

Live help for college admissions

Brainfuse's online counselors help students navigate the college admissions process, including developing a list of target schools, crafting a well-written admissions essay designed to make students stand out, helping students excel in their admissions interviews, and offering guidance on financial aid and scholarships.
